



Population Pyramid of Maldives Censuses 2006 & 2014





CIVIL SERVANTS CLASSIFIED BY TOP 5 OCCUPATIONS, 2016


















Fish catch by type of Vessels, 2016 (In metric tons)




TOTAL GOVERNMENT REVENUE & EXPENDITURE, 2016







Pension payments made under different schemes, by sex of recipient 2016








