BIRTHS, DEATHS AND NATURAL INCREASE, 1995-2005



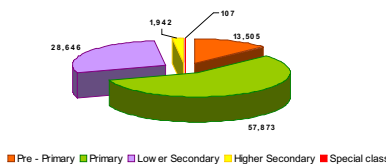

STUDENT ENROLMENT BY EDUCATIONAL LEVEL, 2005

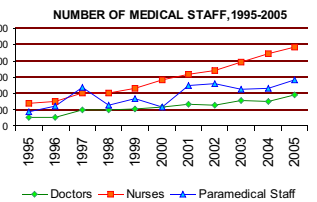

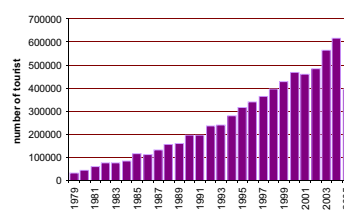

TOURIST ARRIVALS, 1979-2005



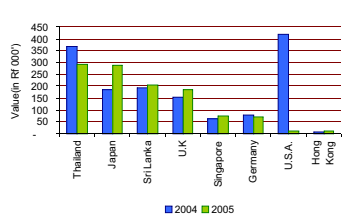
