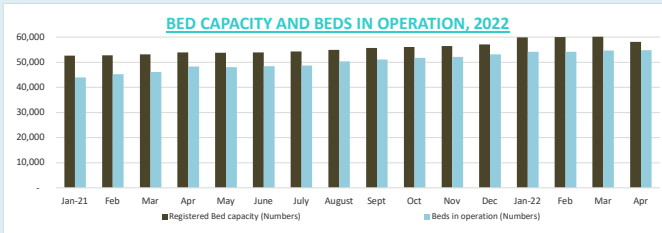
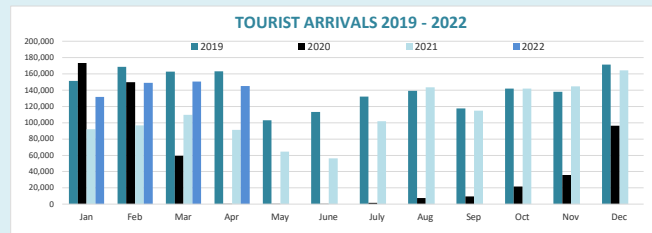

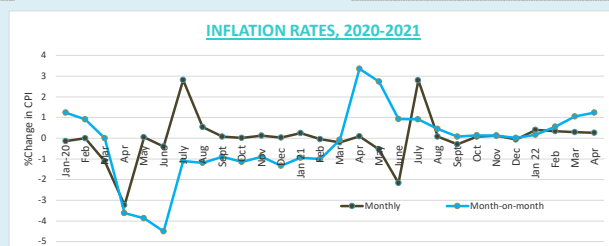
In April 2022, there were 145,280 tourist arrivals, where it showed a decline of 3.6 percent when compared to March 2022.

CPI rose at the All Group Levels in Male' by +0.87% and in Atolls by +0.39% in May 2022

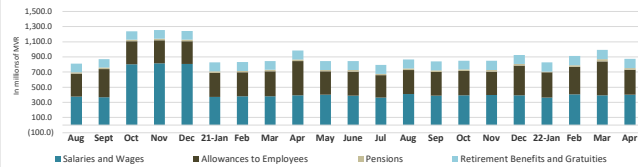
The Consumer Price Index for all groups CPI rose by +2.46% through the year to May 2022, compared to the rise of +1.24% through the year to April 2022.

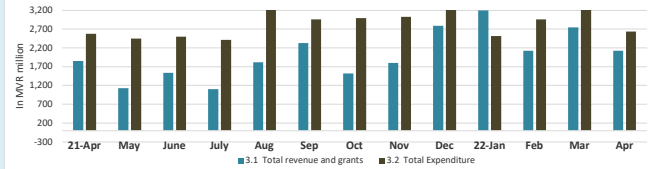

### REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE OF GOVERNMENT- 2020 - 2022

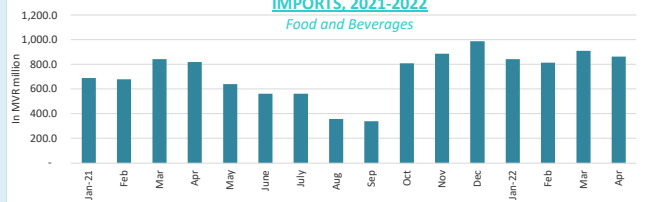

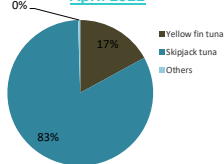

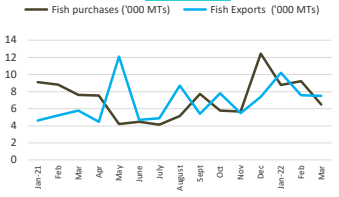
