

SUNSHINE & RAINFALL


During the year 2022, 2,093(mm) rainfall was recorded in Male' and sunshine recorded was 2,837 (hrs).





TOP FIVE OCCUPATIONS OF CIVIL SERVANTS, 2020







As usual majority of the species caught by Maldivian fisherman is Skipjack Tuna, compared to 2021 there is a 6.49% increase in Skipjack Tuna caught during the year 2022. During the year 2022, a total of 126.4 ('000 metric tonnes) of Skipjack Tuna was caught, which accounts to 81% of the fish produced during the vear 2022.






